Welcome to the Christmas edition of our St Albans & District Foodbank newsletter

Reflecting on the past year, 2023 has marked our busiest period to date. We are now open 6 days a week in our 8 Foodbank centres across the district.

None of this would be possible without the incredible support of over 130 volunteers who dedicate their time to collecting, sorting, packing, delivering, and distributing our emergency food parcels. Their efforts have allowed us to assist over 1100 households in need, creating a safe and welcoming space for our clients. As one client aptly put it, "it's the best cup of tea of the week."

While we remain steadfast in our commitment to supporting those in need, it's challenging news that we are now assisting three times as many households as before COVID. Moreover, across the Trussell Trust network, we anticipate this Winter to be the most demanding ever for foodbank services. In response to this growing demand, we've implemented significant changes to the operation of the foodbank, aimed at adapting to the challenges we face. More details about these changes will be shared in the rest of this newsletter.




